The Academic Council at NC has recently approved and purchased a software program called "Turn It In." This cutting-edge technology allows both instructors and students to get the most from the educational process.

When a student submits a paper through "Turn It In," the teacher is able to give deep and meaningful feedback through the software's unique structure and ease of use.

Each submitted paper will be compared to 13 billion web pages and over 90,000 books, journals and periodicals. To combat plagiarism, the software is able to assist students by helping them check for inadvertent plagiarism, errors in quoting material or improperly used content.

Teachers are able to make helpful suggestions and comments within the students' papers as well. Instructors are able to make corrections and give notes right in the text of the paper. This can guide students to a better understanding of the writing process and all it encompasses.
